VPAT

Since the VPAT must be comprehensive, all Section 508 issues on all pages must be corrected to sustain compliance.

Supporting Features	(Second Column on VPAT)
Supports	Use this language when you determine the product fully meets the letter and intent of the Criteria.
Partially Supports	Use this language when you determine the product does not fully meet the letter and intent of the Criteria, but provides some level of access relative to the Criteria.
Supports through Equivalent Facilitation	Use this language when you have identified an alternate way to meet the intent of the Criteria or when the product does not fully meet the intent of the Criteria.
Supports when Combined with Compatible AT	Use this language when you determine the product fully meets the letter and intent of the Criteria when used in combination with Compatible Assistive Technology ("AT"). For example, many software programs can provide speech output when combined with a compatible screen reader (commonly used AT for people who are blind).
Does Not Support	Use this language when you determine the product does not meet the letter or intent of the Criteria.
Not Applicable	Use this language when you determine the Criteria does not apply to the specific product.
Not Applicable - Fundamental Alteration Exception Applies	Use this language when you determine a Fundamental Alteration of the product would be required to meet the Criteria (see the access board's standards for the definition of "fundamental alteration").

Partially Supports	Text equivalents for non-text elements are available to comprehend content and to aid in navigation, with some exceptions. Exceptions include some icons in queues, a pair of "Next" and "Previous" graphic buttons, graphics that show the status of links in the Help section's Table of Contents, expand interfaces for the Overview Pane, and content in the "Attendee Status" graph.
(b) Equivalent alternatives for any multimedia presentation shall be synchronized with the presentation.	Not Applicable	Webpages do not have multimedia presentations.
(c) Web pages shall be designed so that all information conveyed with color is also available without color, for example from context or markup.	Does Not Support	Does not support. When color conveys information, text or programmatically implemented equivalents are not provided. Examples include selected tabs and content in the "Attendee Status" graph.
(d) Documents shall be organized so they are readable without requiring an associated style sheet.	Partially Supports	Webpages are readable when stylesheets are disabled or with user-defined stylesheets, with such exceptions. The majority of headings in Zimbra Collaboration Suite 7.1 do not have structural markup.
(e) Redundant text links shall be provided for each active region of a server-side image map.	Not Applicable	Zimbra Collaboration Suite 7.1 does not have server-side image maps.
(f) Client-side image maps shall be provided instead of server-side image maps except where the regions cannot be defined with an available geometric shape.	Not Application	Zimbra Collaboration Suite 7.1 does not have client-side image maps.

(g) Row and column headers shall be identified for data tables.	Partially Supports	Row and column headers of data tables have identifying information, with some exceptions. Exceptions include column headers of many data tables, including calendars, which do not have structural markup or are in different tables than associated data.

Dynamic content does not obtain immediate programmatic focus.

Not Applicable	Zimbra Collaboration Suite 7.1 does not have applets or plug-ins.

<p>(o) A method shall be provided that permits users to skip repetitive navigation links.</p>	<p>Partially Supports</p>	<p>AT and keyboard users can bypass repetitive navigation links, with some exceptions. Keyboard users do not have a method to bypass the Toolbar and Overview Pane if they tab to a form field above the repetitive navigation interfaces and then wish to return to the main content.</p>
<p>(p) When a timed response is required, the user shall be alerted and given sufficient time to indicate more time is required.</p>	<p>Not Applicable</p>	<p>Zimbra Collaboration Suite 7.1 does not require time responses.</p>
