

VMware Transparency and Law Enforcement Report

January – December 2022¹

VMware publishes annual reports to show number of law enforcement requests received from around the world.

Request types

Subpoenas: valid and binding legal demands for information or testimony issued by courts, law enforcement agencies, or grand juries without prior judicial oversight.

Other court orders: valid and binding court orders issued by local, state, or federal courts.

Search warrants: valid and binding legal demands issued by local, state, or federal courts upon a showing of probable cause and of specific identification of places to be searched and items to be seized.

The following tables show the number of law enforcement requests received for the period of January to December 2022 seeking customer data.

Information types

Content²: as used in the [VMware Terms of Service](#), refers to content uploaded by the customer or its users into the Service Offering for processing, storage, or hosting, but does not include (a) Third-Party Content, or (b) Account Information. For purposes of this definition, “content” means any data, including all text, sound, video, or image files, and software (including machine images).

Account Information (non-content)³: refers to information customers provide to us in connection with creation or administration of the customer account, including names, usernames, phone numbers, email addresses, and billing information associated with the customer account.

U.S. National Security Requests

U.S. national security requests may include Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act (FISA) warrants, orders, directives, or national security letters. USA FREEDOM Act Section 603 limits the manner in which companies can report national security requests. Subject to these restrictions, VMware can only report the number of national security requests in specific numerical bands at particular time intervals.
