For example, many software programs can provide speech output when combined with a compatible screen reader, commonly used AT for people who are blind.

<p>(a) When software is designed to run on a system that has a keyboard, product functions shall be executable from a keyboard where the function itself or the result of performing a function can be discerned textually.</p>	<p>Supports With Exceptions</p>	<p>Interfaces are keyboard accessible with some exceptions. A mouse or other pointing device is required to reach, activate and/or select some elements.</p> <p>Keyboard-only users and JAWS users cannot reach the navigation tabs or the navigation list view. JAWS users may use the JAWS cursor to focus the navigation list. The navigation tabs provide keyboard accelerator commands.</p>
<p>(b) Applications shall not disrupt or disable activated features of other products that are identified as accessibility features, where those features are developed and documented according to industry standards. Applications also shall not disrupt or disable activated features of any operating system that are identified as accessibility features where the application programming interface for those accessibility features has been documented by the manufacturer of the operating system and is available to the product developer.</p>	<p>Supports with Exceptions</p>	<p>Site Recovery Manager 5.5 does not interfere with activated or available accessibility features of other products or operating systems, with some exceptions.</p> <p>The colors of tabs and content under Summary tabs remain the same even after a user selects the Windows High Contrast option.</p>

Also, JAWS says "read-only" when users tab to active links.
(e) When bitmap images are used to identify controls, status indicators, or other programmatic elements, the meaning assigned to those images shall be consistent throughout an application's performance.	Supports	Bitmap images are used in a consistent manner.
(f) Textual information shall be provided through operating system functions for displaying text. The minimum information that shall be made available is text content, text input caret location, and text attributes.	Supports	Site Recovery Manager 5.5 provides textual information through operating system functions, with some exceptions. JAWS does not read the name of any dialog window that appears.
(g) Applications shall not override user selected contrast and color selections and other individual display attributes.	Supports with Exceptions	Site Recovery Manager 5.5 honors user-selected display attributes with some exceptions. The colors of tabs and content under Summary tabs remain the same even after a user selects the Windows High Contrast option.
